Council Report October 14, 2024

PRESENT: Michele Dupy, Prissy Rumel, Judy Downing, Anita Holubec, Bill Albert, Carolyn Haverland, Danny Smith, Janet Doss and Charlotte Albert.

RESOLUTION: To ensure the continuity of St. Peter's Church, in accordance with St. Peter's Constitution and Bylaws, the Council unanimously passed the following Resolution:

"We, the members of the Council of St. Peter's Church of Coupland, do agree and attest by our signatures below that St. Peter's Church of Coupland is affiliated with United Church of Christ (known as UCC) and do hereby establish a <u>moratorium</u> on any future Council or Congregation voting to leave the UCC for a period of Two (2) years, at which time this resolution may be extended."

MEMBERSHIP DEFINITIONS: Council approved proposed updates to St. Peter's Constitution and Bylaws regarding membership definitions.

CALLED CONGREGATIONAL MEETING: A meeting was scheduled immediately following Worship Service on **Sunday, November 17**, to vote on the proposed updates to the Constitution and Bylaws regarding membership definitions.

INSURANCE: Danny has been requesting bids for our Property and Liability insurance, which renews on November 15. Council voted to give Danny authority to select the insurance company for annual renewal, inform Council through email, and to confirm coverage.

FACILITIES USAGE AGREEMENT: Council discussed updates and pricing. A revised Agreement will be presented at the November Council Meeting for approval.

NOMINATIONS: Anita, Carolyn and Janet will be completing their terms on Council in January 2025. Council will consider nominees to fill those positions.

INTERIM PASTOR: Discussion about search timing between Interim and Settled Pastor continuing into 2025. Council agreed to repost the Interim Position on the UCC Website.

CHILDREN'S CHURCH: Discussion regarding increasing number of children and structure of the Activity Time. Garage Sale proceeds (~\$3500) are earmarked for lesson and craft materials and the paid Attendant.

WORK DAY, NOVEMBER 2: Council scheduled a Work Day from 9 am to Noon to work on outdoor projects, including trimming trees and removing some flower beds to return the areas to grass.

TOTENFEST, NOVEMBER 3 –Charlotte will contact the six families who lost loved ones this past year and facilitate the remembrance ceremony.

NEW MEMBERS: Several people will be joining St. Peter's during Worship service on **November 10**. Anita will arrange a reception to be held after church. Van Herd (our past pianist), wishes to transfer his membership to St. Peter's and, given his distance, will be as active as possible. Council approved Van's request.

ADULT CHRISTMAS PARTY: Ted and Cynthia Wittliff have agreed to host the party on December 7.

CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PROGRAM: Stephanie Ochoa will direct our Christmas Program during Worship Service on **December 15** and ALL children are encouraged to participate.

SOCIAL SUNDAYS: Due to the holidays, there will be no Social Sunday meals in November or December.
