Irene was born the ninth child of Johanna and Pastor Gustav Haertwig on October 9, 1943, in Waldenburg, Germany, during of the chaos of WWII. Her mother was killed in a bombing raid a year later.

In 1973, she met the love of her life, Pastor John Sumner, in Washington, DC and they were married in 1975 in Quincy, MA.

Irene and John have three children, Anneli, Hans-Michael, and Christian, and four grandchildren.

## September Mission Project FAMILY VILLAGE FARM

St. Peter's Church has long supported the Family Village Farm, founded in 1969 to care for orphans and the elderly in Southern India.

Children are given food, clothing, shelter, love, and training in a home-like setting, with ten to twelve children, a mother, and grandparents living in a family-type group. The adults, who are from difficult circumstances, help care for the children while benefiting from housing and support.

The farm also includes staff housing, a bakery, poultry farm and dairy. Boys are trained to tend crops and fruit trees and the girls are trained in sewing, making school uniforms and hospital linen.

The King's Matriculation School serves the children at Family Village Farm, plus 300 children from nearby villages. Education helps the children gain skills to be self-supporting in the future.

Boys can live at the farm until the age of 18. Girls, if they do not have living parents, are allowed to stay until marriage.

Global Ministries (the mission organization of the United Church of Christ and Christian Church/ Disciples of Christ) has a Child and Elder Sponsorship Program to provide food, clothing, and education. They also help with funding for capital improvements and infrastructure.

## In Memorium Irene Martha Elfriede Sumner

October 9, 1943-August 1, 2024

Irene Haertwig was born the ninth child of Johanna (b. Askevold) and Pastor Gustav Haertwig in the midst of the chaos of WWII on October 9, 1943 in Waldenburg, Silesia, Germany. Her parents had evacuated from Witten in the Ruhr valley to the safer area of eastern Germany where Irene was born. They moved back to Witten where, a year later, a bombing raid prompted sirens to sound, forcing everyone to leave their packed suitcases behind and head to the basement. It was that night that Johanna held her youngest child, Irene, in her arms as a concrete wall fell, killing her instantly, but protecting Irene.

Extended family members subsequently raised Irene for several years in Waldeck, Germany. Irene later learned she was fed horse's milk to sustain her given the lack of food during the war. Irene eventually reunited with her father, six older siblings who endured a harrowing walk through post-war Germany, and two other siblings in Waldeck.

Following the tumultuous war years, Irene's father Pastor Haertwig moved back to Witten and remarried. There Irene would learn to live from Care packages, eating the dry milk power by the spoonful, and eating oatmeal daily. After those post-war years, she never, ever ate oatmeal again. She later enjoyed the best cow's milk after the family moved to a country church in Gemünden, Westerwald, Germany, where she would eat her way through numerous parishioners' homes. She was always hungry, she said, after so little sustenance during the war. She loved it in Gemünden, and thought it was so peaceful compared to the rubble and bomb craters she learned to play in around Witten.

By age 14, she was ready to move on, so she relocated to Waldeck to join her older sister Helga. There she attended school and took over milking the six cows on the farm of Helga's husband, Paul Neuhaus. She learned many farming and gardening skills that stayed with her for her entire life. She could cook and bake like a farm wife for 10-15 people per meal, load hay bales, help slaughter a pig, and always loved to get her hands dirty in the soil. Wherever she lived, her gardens were the envy of so many neighbors, and her cakes were the highlight of every meal.

By age 18, she was ready to explore the wider world and decided to go to nursing school. She attended Diakoni -Krankenhaus Nursing School in Wiesbaden and received her RN in 1964. She found out very early that she loved the operating room and became an OR nurse for over ten years, working in the Universitatklinik in Berlin. Even in hospice care, she talked to the nurses about her love of the OR. She spoke about how she would repair rubber gloves used in the OR by gluing holes closed, learned the use of ether with a funnel and gauze, and straightened and sharpened hypodermic needles for use again. [Can you imagine?]

In 1973, she met the love of her life, Pastor John Sumner in Washington, DC and they were married in 1975 in Quincy, MA. She eventually became the mother of three beautiful children, Anneli, Hans-Michael, and Christian. They became the focus of her entire life. John decided to become a U.S. Army chaplain and thus began the 20-year journey of military life, moving overseas almost every 3-4 years. After the military, Irene followed John to pastorates in Belvidere, TN and Coupland, TX. She never complained about the moves and always embraced a new challenge. In her retirement years, she enjoyed carpentry work around the house and gardening. Nothing gave her greater pleasure than being outside in the fresh air and seeing things grow. She also devoted herself to caring for the first three grandchildren, J.J., Cameron, and Rosie, often daily.

Irene was active and busy until just two months before her death and decided early on not to endure any extraordinary measures. Cancer far too rapidly ended her life, and she died on August 1, 2024, surrounded by her family and newest granddaughter, two-year-old Ellie who was belting an original lullaby to her "Omama". Irene left us at that perfect moment and brought us a sense of completion, a life so well lived.
