St. Peter's Annual Congregational Meeting was held after Worship Service on Sunday, January 19.

## Minister's Musings

Rev. Linda McWhorter

"What is that sweet thing that comes sometimes to touch me at the thought of God?... I struggle deliciously to prevent myself from leaving this thing which I desire to embrace forever." - *Hugh of St. Victor* 

Hugh of St. Victor was a 12th century French theologian and Headmaster of a theology academy, the Abbey of St. Victor, in Paris. He was a prolific author, influenced by the theology of Augustine of Hippo, and wrote hundreds of treatises on theology, biblical commentaries, mysticism, philosophy, and the arts.

Surviving today are also many of his letters and sermons. The beautiful quote I included here refers to his experience of the divine, how sweet that divine connection can be, and how difficult it is to leave the divine embrace when it is time to go and do other things (like chores!)

Think of time when you have felt this desire for God. Maybe it is while you are sitting in prayer or reading scripture which takes you away from the world for a time. Maybe it has been while in worship, feeling moved by a particular hymn or prayer or sermon message. Possibly it has happened to you while holding a newborn for the first time or sitting at the bed-side holding the hand of a dying loved one.

Or perhaps this feeling of divine connection and closeness has happened to you while out in nature, on the back 40, or your favorite fishing hole, and you find yourself contemplating the awesomeness of creation with deep gratitude for life.

Whenever this experience of God's spirit meeting yours happens, don't let it pass unnoticed and unappreciated. Grasp it, savor it, thank God for it, and say a little prayer asking that it come again. It is God's heart reaching out to your heart, and it is glorious!
