## Council Report November 11, 2024

**PRESENT**: Prissy Rumel, Judy Downing, Anita Holubec, Bill Albert, Carolyn Haverland, Danny Smith, Janet Doss and Charlotte Albert. **ABSENT**: Michele Dupy.

**NOVEMBER 17 CONGREGATIONAL MEET-ING:** Ballots and voting procedures were approved.

**INSURANCE**: Danny signed the renewal of our Property and Liability insurance, but is continuing to work with the insurance company to request a discount for our fire-resistant siding.

**FACILITIES USAGE AGREEMENT**: Final revisions for the agreement were approved. Anyone who wants to use our facilities for non-church events can download the paperwork from our <u>website</u> or request it from the office.

<u>Please remember that all church events, including Team meetings, must be scheduled with Barbara in the office to avoid schedule conflicts.</u>

**NOMINATIONS**: Council discussed possible candidates for leadership positions.

**PASTOR SEARCH:** Council is pursuing the hiring of a part-time pastor to fill in while we continue our search for a settled pastor.

**DECEMBER EVENTS**: Schedules and details for December events were approved.

**ELECTRONIC GIVING**: Prissy is finalizing the arrangements for St. Peter's to begin accepting donations through Venmo.

**PARSONAGE**: Emma Ortega has done a thorough cleaning of the parsonage and William Dupy is continuing to work on some repairs.

CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS: These documents have been revised many times over the years and are in need of an administrative overhaul to make them more consistent and easier to read and understand. Michele will lead a Team to review the documents and make recommendations.

# Constitution and Bylaws Revisions Approved

At a Called Congregational Meeting on November 17, the 47 members present **unanimously approved** changes to the language in St. Peter's Constitution and Bylaws regarding membership.

These changes allow members who do not regularly participate in the life of the church to remain as "Associate Members," instead of being removed entirely from the membership rolls as required by the previous Constitution and Bylaws.

The Council proposed these changes after making phone calls to dozens of members and getting feedback on their relationship with St. Peter's Church.

# Meet our Licensed Minister



After attending classes for two years, Charlotte Albert was licensed in 2006 as a Minister through the Heart of Texas Association of the South Central Conference of the United Church of Christ.

This year Charlotte has been vital to the life of St. Peter's as she volunteers to handle Pastoral Care and other functions that would normally be filled by our full-time pastor.

She calls and visits our sick and home-bound members and those in grief, and has conducted several funeral services.

Charlotte is leading a weekly Confirmation Class for three young people and she recently coordinated the joining of four new members into our church.

She organized our Totenfest remembrance of members who died in the past year and the Kirchenfest recognition of prior confirmands, and she attends Church Council meetings.

On top of all that, she continues her usual work in teaching Adult Sunday School, assisting in the service of Communion, serving on the Mission Team, working with the Kitchen and Events Team to plan and serve at special events, and decorating the tables in the Fellowship Hall for events.

Charlotte has been actively involved in church activities as long as she can remember. She grew up in the Nazarene faith. In 1966, she joined Bethel United Church of Christ in Houston and found a perfect fit with her religious beliefs.

After moving to the Beaukiss Community, Charlotte and her husband, Bill, joined St. Peter's in 1981. She was active in church life and shortly became very involved in the UCC association, conference, and national church, serving as a delegate representing St. Peter's and serving on committees and boards.
